Legal/Ethical	Problem	Solution
Legal	I require photographs of animals and scenes from around the world, but my travels are limited and to get these images I would have to use other photographer's work, this could cause a problem due to copyright.	I can either pay for the images or I can source them and give credits to each photographer at the bottom of their images that I have used.
Ethical	There are drastic photo's that really show global warming's effects at their worst and they would have a greater impact on the audience, but this is meant to be a family game and some children may not be able to play the game due to the images.	Add an age restriction to the game and restrict myself to using images that are distressful but still child friendly.
Legal	I have borrowed concepts of other games to create parts of my game, like Charades for example. These companies may try suing me for this.	Always give credit where it is due, and adapt their rules and concepts to make it different from their own.
Ethical	As the game's purpose is to raise awareness about Climate change, I am concerned that the challenge cards stating that a certain country has done something bad, like China has increased it's average Carbon emissions and you are penalized. People from these countries may take offence.	Keep all information used factual and unbiased, so even if the primary target audience for the game is the UK, still use facts that may place the UK in a bad light.
